



THIBODAUX, LOUISIANA

Thibodaux was deeply affected by the Civil War in the early 1800s. Many local men left to join the fight, and Thibodaux produced its own military groups to engage in the conflict. The war eventually came to the Thibodaux area with the Battle of Lafourche Crossing and the Battle of George Plantation. After the war, the Reconstruction Period also played a part in Thibodaux's history. As the entire country struggled to recover from the war and reconstruction, one event of major historical impact in Thibodaux was the 1887 sugar cane labor riot.

By 1880, the city was moving forward. The local sugarcane was overhauled and the brick yards thrived. A new saw mill was built. Sugar cultivation, refining and trade began to be re-established, and the rural area supported a significant increase in the growth and sale of produce. A bridge was built over the bayou at Jackson Street. Sidewalks and drainage ditches were added or rebuilt.

In 1888, Thibodaux became the site of the U.S. Postal Service's second Rural Free Delivery Service in the United States, and by the turn of the 20th Century Thibodaux could boast of having a public waterworks system, telephones, an ice factory, boiler works and a barrel factory. Hotels, restaurants, barber shops, and all of the assorted service industries necessary to the success of a city were found in Thibodaux. The local area was also home to an industry featuring the collection, ginning and sale of Spanish moss, which was found in abundance hanging from the many stately oak and cypress trees in the region.

St. Joseph Catholic Church served a central role in the religious life of the city, as the entire region remained predominantly Catholic until well into the 20th Century. There was also a strong Protestant representation in the city. St. John Episcopal Church is recognized as one of the local structures designed by noted architect Henry Howell.

Schools play an important role in the strength of the community. Early schools were generally parochial or private. Two of the most prominent early schools were Mount Carmel Academy and Convent, a parochial girls school founded in 1855, and Thibodaux College, a parochial boys school founded in 1858. These two eventually joined to form the basis of the modern E.D. White Catholic High. As the community thrived, public schools became more available. Today, two public high schools are the Thibodaux High School and Virtual Academy of Lafourche. Thibodaux is also the home of Nicholls State University, a four-year state university named after two-time Governor Francis T. Nicholls, a resident of Thibodaux.


Some of the notable people who called Thibodaux and the surrounding area home were: General Leonidas Polk, Episcopal Bishop of Louisiana; Edward Douglas White, Jr., Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court; Professor Emanuel Child, a respected musician and educator; Donald Braxton Bragg, G.S.A., Jim Bono, famous for the knife named for him and for his role in the Battle of the Alamo; and Dr. Pierre Roussart, a physician credited with discovery of heart pulsations. Some prominent political figures from Thibodaux include Andrew Price, Whitman Martin, Numa Montet and Billy Tauzin. Today the city of Thibodaux is a thriving community of over 15,000 people from a diverse range of ethnic backgrounds.

Besides the indigenous ancestral groups, the area has claimed a significant ancestry from expelled French Acadians, known commonly as "Cajuns." Many Thibodaux residents also claim ancestral ties to French Canada, Africa, the Canary Islands, France, Germany, England and Italy.

Thibodaux is home to many festivals and cultural events. Festivals celebrate different foods, music and cultures. One of the most prominent festivals in Thibodaux is the annual Fireman's Fair and Parade, which helps to finance the respected Thibodaux Volunteer Fire Department. The parade is one of the oldest continuously running parades in the United States. Another prominent festival is the Thibodauxville Fall Festival held every year during the second weekend of November. Mardi Gras is a family-friendly season in Thibodaux and the city hosts several parades each year. Sports events range from preschool T-ball to college athletics and the annual Manning Passing Academy at NSU. There is an active community band, a community theater group, a historical society, and many civic groups. The city is also home to the Jean Lafitte National Park, named in honor of the legendary local privateer/pirate who was known to use Bayou Lafourche as a main route of access to his warehouses.


A large civic center caters to the needs of the community. Thibodaux Regional Medical Center and its multiple service-specific facilities and staff offer world-class medical care for residents of the entire region. As parish seat, Thibodaux is the site of offices for many federal and state agencies offering services to the public.

The exotic beauty of the environment, the picturesque stature of the local architecture, the friendliness of the people, the diversity of the cultures, and the strength of the economy all serve to highlight the charm of the Queen City along Bayou Lafourche, "Louisiana's Cajun Bayou."







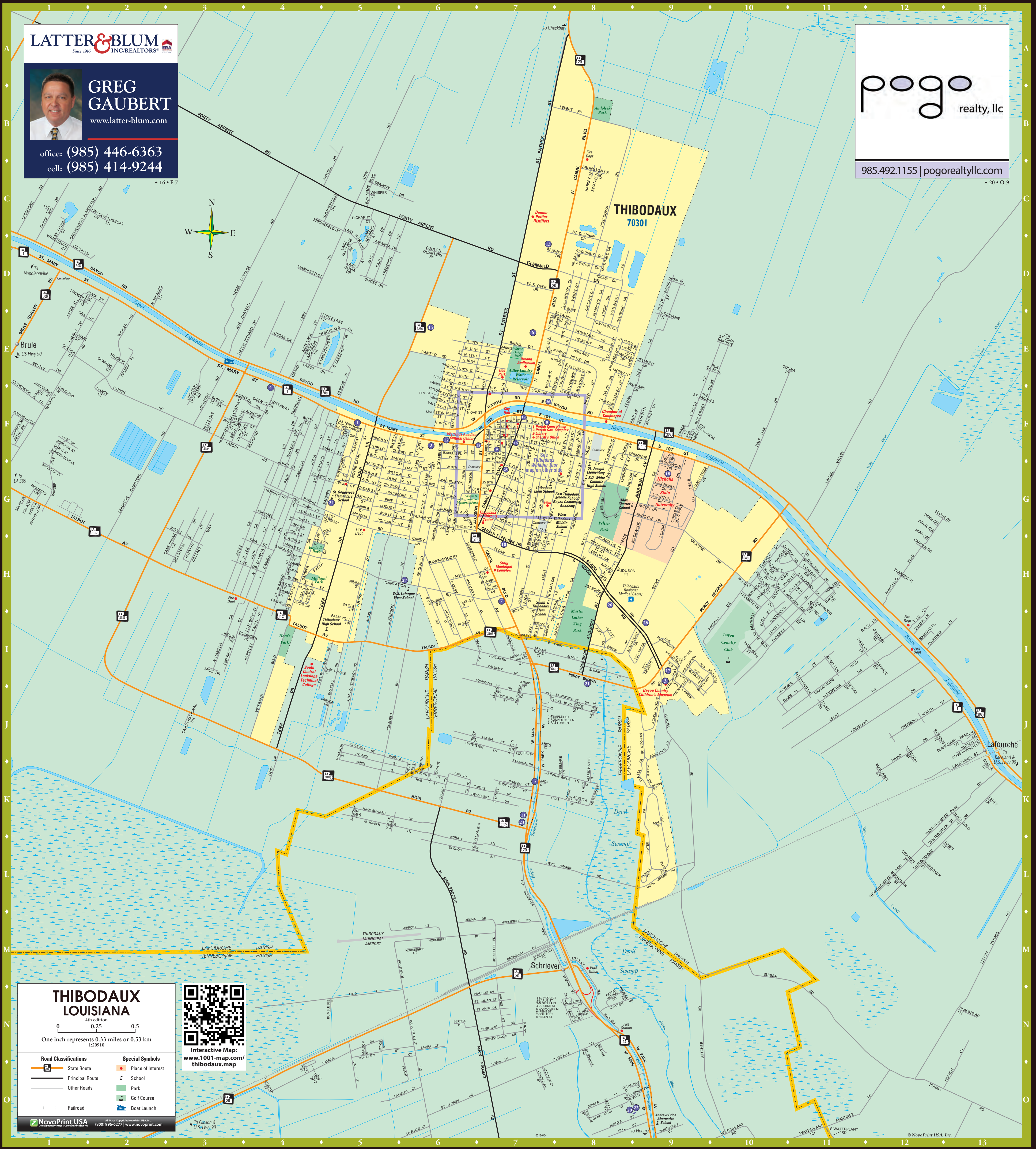
